Required Materials

All students should have the following items for band:

- 1. An instrument in working condition.
- 2. Tradition of Excellence Method Book #1 (for your instrument) by Bruce Pearson
- 3. Pencil
- 4. Folder for full-band music

Additional items are listed below by instrument:

Flute: 1. Flute tuning rod (should come with instrument 2. Handkerchief or small piece of cloth for cleaning inside the instrument	Clarinet: 1. Extra reeds (these will wear out or break and need to be replaced) 2. Cork grease and cleaning swab 3. Mouthpiece Cap
Saxophone: 1. Extra reeds (these will wear out or break and need to be replaced) 2. Cork grease and cleaning swab 3. Mouthpiece cap	Trumpet: 1. Bottle of Valve Oil 2. Slide grease 3. Soft cloth for cleaning
Trombone: 1. Slide Oil 2. Soft cloth for cleaning	Percussion: 1. Sticks/Mallets 2. Practice pad

Suggested Materials

These may help when practicing at home:

- 1. Wire Music Stand
- 2. Metronome (keeps the beat)
- 3. Chromatic Tuner (check to see if your instrument is in tune)
- 4. Additional cleaning materials such as; mouthpiece brushes, pad savers, etc.)

Student Responsibilities and Expectations

As a member of the band you are an important part of a team. The group is relying on you to arrive prepared and on time, to have a positive attitude and to do your best. Because lessons are during the day, you will be responsible to make up the work that you have missed in your regular classes.

Responsibilities

- 1. Be prepared- Have your instrument, pencil, method book and supplies (sticks, reeds, valve oil, etc..) at every lesson and band rehearsal.
- 2. Be on time- Know your lesson schedule
- 3. Make up your missed work- both in band and in class.
- 4. Practice at home- Take your instrument home every day and manage your time wisely.
- 5. Always do your best!

Rehearsal Etiquette:

- 1. No food or drink (except water) allowed in the band room.
- 2. Show respect to each other. We all have different challenges and needs.
- 3. Use the bathroom before coming to band.
- 4. Remember that the instrument you use in band is very valuable. Please be careful in the band room and respect your classmates and their space. Instruments can break easily and aren't always easily or cheaply fixed.



Home Practice Tips for Success

Students

- 1. Find a quiet, distraction-free place. If possible set up a "practice area" in your room or somewhere in the house. Your practice area might include a sturdy chair, a music stand, a place to put your instrument, and a CD player if you would like to play with the cd.
- 2. Schedule a time to practice each day (maybe include it in your homework).
- 3. Always play with good posture.
- 4. Take your time! It's good to go slow!
- 5. **Break it down**. If your'e stuck on a long song or phrase, practice a little section and then put it together.
- 6. Three times is the charm. Make sure you can play the piece correctly three times in a row before moving on to the next song.

Parents

- 1. Become involved in what your child is doing. Ask them what they've been learning in band or request they play a song that they enjoy.
- 2. If you don't know how to play an instrument, have your child teach you! If you play an instrument yourself, join in!
- 3. Encourage your child to always do his/her best. As with anything, positive encouragement goes a long way.
- 4. Check to make sure your child has completed their practice homework.
- 5. Inspire! Find a cd or youtube video of his/her instrument being performed by a professional or attend a concert! This is an exciting time. Enjoy!
